### **Roseanna Tucker, dated December 18, 2017**

- I1-1        The comment asserts that Los Angeles jails do not keep our community safe and states that the new jail is not going to solve the underlying problem of homelessness, poverty, and crime within the city. Instead, the commenter asserts that it will exacerbate those problems through the diversion of “city funds” that could be used for more constructive program. The Proposed Project would not construct a new jail, instead, it would replace the existing MCJ to provide improved medical, substance use disorder and mental health treatment within detention facilities for inmate-patients requiring more care than the general inmate population. The Proposed Project would not increase the number of jail beds in the County system. The Proposed Project focuses on treatment and diversion, not just incarceration. This comment relates to the merits of the Proposed Project and not the environmental analysis included in the Draft EIR or the environmental impacts of the Project. The Responses to Comments document, including this comment letter, will be provided to the County of Los Angeles Board of Supervisors so that these concerns will be presented directly to the decision makers prior to consideration of whether or not to approve the Proposed Project.

### **Bernie Eisenberg (December 8, 2017)**

- I2-1           The comment asserts that education, jobs, homes, single payer medical care should be provided, not more jails.
